The Ozarks Transportation Organization announces a public comment period for the public to review and comment on proposed amendments to the 2011-2014 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP is a schedule of transportation improvements planned by various agencies in the Ozarks Transportation Organization boundary over the next four years. To be eligible for federal funds, a project must be included in the TIP.

The following amendments have been requested:

- Greene County is requesting the addition of a project to remove two existing bridges and realign Farm Road 186.
- The City of Battlefield is requesting an amendment to add a project to conduct an engineering study to extend Third Street to the Battlefield Municipal Complex.
- The City of Battlefield is requesting an amendment to add a project to construct a sidewalk along Elm Street from Cloverdale lane to the Battlefield Municipal Complex.
- The City of Battlefield is requesting an amendment to add a project to construct missing sidewalk along Cloverdale Lane to complete the current gap.
- The City of Battlefield is requesting an amendment to add a project to conduct an engineering study and plans for a new bicycle and pedestrian trail along Highway M.

The amendments will be available for review at the Ozarks Transportation Organization, 117 Park Central Square, Suite 107 and at ozarkstransportation.org. The public comment period will begin on December 1, 2010 and end on December 15, 2010. The OTO Board of Directors will review and possibly approve the amendments at a December 16, 2010 Board Meeting, held at 12:00 p.m. at 840 Boonville Avenue, Springfield MO, fourth floor conference room. After reviewing recommendations and entertaining public comment, the OTO Board of Directors will decide whether to formally adopt the amendments.
