The Ozarks Transportation Organization is seeking input on its public participation process. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) requires every designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to maintain and update a Public Participation Plan (PPP). The Ozarks Transportation Organization, as the region's MPO, is responsible for this update. The PPP outlines the policies, objectives, and techniques used by OTO to achieve public involvement. As part of the PPP, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) requires MPOs to evaluate the effectiveness of their public involvement strategies. OTO is currently in the process of creating a comprehensive evaluation of its public outreach strategies and will be releasing a draft of its current PPP on November 2, 2009.

In an effort to evaluate and improve current outreach and participation strategies, OTO is seeking the input and feedback of interested parties. OTO will be holding a meeting of its Public Participation Plan Committee on October 27, from 5:30 to 6:45 p.m. at the Library Station, 2535 N. Kansas Expressway. This meeting is open to the public.
