Pat Lloyd called the meeting to order at 1:37 p.m.

#### I. Administration

#### A. Introductions

Mr. Pat Lloyd thanked Mr. Conklin for his time served and the leadership he provided OTO over the last 2 years. Everyone in attendance showed their gratitude for his years of service by clapping.

#### B. Approval of Technical Planning Committee Meeting Agenda

Ms. Carol Cruise motioned to approve the meeting agenda as presented. Mr. Ralph Rognstad seconded the motion. The meeting agenda for September 15, 2010 was approved unanimously.

#### C. Approval of the July 22, 2010 Regular Meeting Minutes

Mr. Ralph Rognstad motioned to approve the minutes from July 22, 2010. Mr. Roger Howard seconded the motion. The TPC minutes were approved unanimously.

#### D. Public Comment Period for All Agenda Items

Mr. Pat Lloyd opened the meeting to public comments, as there were approximately 70 residents from the Farm Road 170 area represented in the meeting. Mr. Lloyd stated the meeting was to determine whether this issue should be viewed independently or as part of the Journey 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan Update. He stated the meeting would only be open for public comments not questions. Mr. Lloyd also stated a Subcommittee of 6-8 members had a preliminary meeting to evaluate Republic Road/Farm Road 170 issues. Once a process has been identified, the Subcommittee would meet again to talk about what the next step would be concerning Farm Road 170. The OTO website will be updated with dates of upcoming meeting and documentation concerning the Republic Road/Farm Road 170 issues.

Mr. Lloyd also addressed changing the venue to better fit the group that would be attending to make them more comfortable. Between Mr. Lloyd and Ms. Sara Edwards, they will find a better suited location.

Mr. Rob Aiken, Farm Road 166 Resident, spoke to the committee concerning the expansion of 164/170 and the 60/65 development. He represented the people who live/work within the 60/65 development. He stated that all of the residents within this area opposed proposed improvements. He stated that most of the residents moved to the area to find solitude from the business of the Springfield. Most residents felt the development was unnecessary, costly and harmful. He stated that current traffic patterns did not support such an expansion. He stated a study needs to be done to show what the environmental impact of such a development would be. According to current stats from the Chamber of Commerce, there are currently 1,545,000 Square Feet of unused commercial/retail space in the Springfield area. For this reason, residents feel the 60/65 expansion would be unnecessary at this time. He brought up that the present East/West arterial (Highway 60) that connects Rogersville, Springfield & Republic is all that is necessary to connect those cities. The residents feel the expansion of Farm Road 164 will bring down their property values and destroy the neighborhoods they have come to love.

Mr. Patrick Platter, Neale & Newman, representing the residents of the Forrest Ridge Property Owners Association, spoke of additional concerns. Mr. Platter sent a letter of opposition to the Major Thoroughfare Plan. He questioned OTO's representation of the study of the Greene County Major Thoroughfare Plan Planning Board Case No. 1786. It was explained that approximately 3 months ago, Greene County asked OTO to prepare an independent transportation study to determine what the growth and expansion for this area will be in following years and what would be fair and logical for the residents of this area.

Greene County provided OTO with a questionnaire to establish their recommendations for the area in the years to come. The questionnaire consisted of 5 questions:

- 1. From a regional & long-term planning perspective, is the proposed connection of Republic Road from Glenstone Avenue East to some point on Farm Road 170 a benefit to the community and a suitable revision to the Thoroughfare Plan?
- 2. From a regional & long-term planning perspective, does a route from the new interchange on US 65 into the existing transportation system connecting with Farm Road 164 seem more fitting than a route connection to Farm Road 170?
- 3. From a regional & long-term planning perspective, does a route from the new interchange of US into the existing transportation system using a "dogleg" route for a connection South from the 60/65 development to an outer road along Highway 60 to connect to J Highway just North of the future Highway 60 interchange, seem more appropriate than a route connecting with Farm Road 170?
- 4. Is Greene County standard of one (1) mile primary arterial spacing consistent with the regional transportation needs?
- 5. Does OTO have any alternative that might be more appropriate?

OTO staff is reviewing the questionnaire and working with Greene County to address the questions. Mr. Neal suggested OTO conduct a traffic impact study analysis before making a decision to present to Greene County. In researching, Mr. Neal found studies from Chapel, North Carolina & Avondale, Arizona that he felt significant to the issues faced by Farm Road 170 residents. He found 6 additional issues which were suggested for the committee review when considering this project:

- 1. What will the future traffic conditions be without the proposed traffic developments? What is the future of the status quo?
- 2. Is the proposed arterial development consistent with the Greene County Land Use Plan?
- 3. What is the impact the proposed development will have on existing & future transportation systems?
- 4. What are the current transportation system's operational characteristics?
- 5. What is the current trip generation?
- 6. What are the distribution and assigned estimates?

The Technical Committee has received several letters opposing the improvement of Republic Road and Farm Road 170 which are on file in the OTO office.

The concerned citizens were interested in seeing a map of the proposed development. Mr. Pat Lloyd said the Subcommittee would address this issue in their next scheduled meeting. He advised the citizens to monitor OTO's website for the date of this meeting and updates concerning Farm Road 170. Mr. Tim Conklin advised everyone OTO's website has a wealth of information concerning the Farm Road 170 and Major Thoroughfare Plan. Mr. Pat Lloyd stated that any recommendation made by OTO and Technical Planning Committee would be objective and fair in all aspects.

#### E. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Conklin stated that OTO staff assisted the Springfield Strategic Transportation Plan Committee with the preparation and completion of the transportation element to be incorporated into the LRTP.

The OTO Board of Directors selected Cinda Rogers, CPA PC to audit for FY 2010 which is scheduled for September  $20 - 23^{rd}$ .

OTO sent out an RFP for visualization graphics for the LRTP. The OTO staff awarded the project to Olsson Associates to perform the work. There will be seven sites selected within the area to illustrate urban design principals incorporating multimodal users. The UPWP budgeted \$5,000 for services provided.

OTO has completed the final Tiger II grant application. It was submitted on August 23, 2010. The application is available on the OTO website, <a href="www.Ozarkstransportation.org">www.Ozarkstransportation.org</a>, giving additional information concerning the projects submitted by OTO.

Mr. Conklin discussed his resignation from OTO as Executive Director as of September 24, 2010. He stated the OTO Executive Committee met, Friday, September 10, 2010, naming Sara Edwards as Interim Executive Director, until a replacement is found. They also advised staff to begin advertising the position. It will be placed on various sites such as APA, Ite, and others.

The MoDOT Cost Share Committee approved the Chestnut Railroad Grade Separation Project in Springfield at their July meeting.

Mr. Conklin confirmed OTO is monitoring the Ozone Standard with EPA. EPA has postponed their announcement regulating the new Ozone Level Standards until the end of October 2010. According to Missouri DNR, EPA is using the most current data in their study which is from 2008-2010. This could potential impact the Springfield region. The last 3 year average level for Fellows Lake which is the monitor for the region was 67ppb. The ozone season is not over yet and the quality assurance/quality control reports have not been completed at this time. DNR believes the region is still less than 70 ppb which would be within the range proposed by EPA. Staff is also reviewing the probable necessities for TMAs regarding Greenhouse Gas Emission Reductions. If the region becomes non-attainment, the state implement plan will be put into place by DNR.

#### F. Bicycle and Pedestrian Committee Report

No report given – Ms. Natasha Longpine was in Kansas City for MOVES training.

#### II. New Business

#### A. OTO Major Thoroughfare Plan Subcommittee Report

OTO staff met with the subcommittee on August 11<sup>th</sup> to discuss the Farm Road 170/East Republic Road request from Greene County and the City of Springfield to determine if this request and recommendation should be reviewed independently or as part of the Journey 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan Update. The Subcommittee decided to return it to the full Technical Committee for further discussion on the approach of Farm Road 170 issues. The Journey 2035 LRTP was discussed in great detail as was the Major Thoroughfare Plan. Traffic studies and forecast were discussed with the different plans that have been adopted by OTO. Mr. Tim Conklin stated that the Journey 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan was a study created to identify the projections of what a healthy growth plan would be for the next 20 years.

Mr. Ralph Rognstad asked when the Journey 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan would be presented to the Board of Directors. Mr. Conklin stated the Plan would be presented in April 2011. Mr. Steve Childers asked how one separates the issues, understanding that expanding this roadway is a significant concern to a lot of people. Recognizing that those affected want a very detailed study, Mr. Childers asked how indepth it should be and does all of that fall on OTO and can it be completed by April 2011? Mr. Conklin addressed the committee by stating the 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan does take in consideration of the future needs of Springfield out through year 2035. It shows the recommendations from OTO. OTO has a vision of the best way to expand the growth of Springfield and surrounding areas. The staff of OTO looks at the transportation system as a whole. OTO will make fair decisions as to what would be best for the expansion of Springfield and surrounding areas. OTO can make recommendations, but it is up to the jurisdiction to make their own decisions.

Mr. Childers stated the Technical Committee realizes OTO's responsibility is to analyze data as it pertains to transportation. Farm Road 170 would have been included in a previous study at some point on a general level. OTO's job is to analyze the data. It is up to the governing jurisdiction to decide whether the expansion will be done or not. It is not the responsibility of OTO to provide the level of detail requested by those affected. Mr. Miller stated that he felt the same as Mr. Childers.

Mr. Rognstad made a motion that the Farm Road 170/Republic Road extension be considered separately from the update of the Major Thoroughfare Plan, taking the time necessary to fully study the issue, while still taking into account information used to prepare the Major Thoroughfare Plan as a whole. Mr. Roger Howard made an amendment to the motion to include that the requesting entity has the right to use all available resources in evaluating an issue.

Mr. Dan Smith questioned the procedures in making amendments to motions. He believes the committee should be consistent. He questioned if an amendment is made to a motion, should it be open for discussion. He felt the committee should be specific in the reasoning of the amendment. Mr. Childers addressed the committee by stating it was

not the committee's responsibility to advise jurisdictions what resources can be used when considering an expansion.

Mr. Lloyd asked Ms. Edwards to repeat Mr. Rognstad's motion and amendments. The original motion was that the Farm Road 170/Republic Road extension shall be considered separately from the update of the Major Thoroughfare Plan, taking the time necessary to fully study the issue, while still taking into account information used to prepare the Major Thoroughfare Plan as a whole with the amendment that Greene County/City of Springfield could use all resources available to them in studying the issues.

Mr. Lloyd stated that based on the nature of the situation, he felt it best to take a roll call vote. Those voting against the motion were: Mr. Pat Lloyd, Ms. Dawne Gardner, Mr. Terry Whaley, Mr. Frank Miller, Mr. Mike Giles, Mr. David Brock, Mr. Don Clark, Mr. Randall Brown, Mr. Jason Haynes, Mr. Dan Watts, Mr. King Coltrin, Mr. Dan Smith, Ms. Carol Cruise, Mr. Steve Childers, Mr. Martin Gugel, and Mr. Bob Atchley. Those voting for the motion were: Mr. Ralph Rognstad and Mr. Roger Howard. Mr. Bill Robinett stated his vote should be abstained because of his position as a state representative.

In addition to the original motion made by Mr. Rognstad, Mr. Childers made the following statement to be added to the motion: the Major Thoroughfare Subcommittee shall not make recommendations beyond OTO's mission, meaning it is not OTO's job to select alignment, but rather to determine if an arterial is needed. The motion was seconded by Ms. Carol Cruise. The motion was approved with one abstention and one nay.

Mr. Lloyd addressed the public by advising them they could stay for the remainder of the meeting if they decided to do so. He also asked for a five minute break from the meeting.

### **B.** Listing of Administrative Modifications to the Transportation Improvement Program

Nine Administrative Modifications to the Transportation Improvement Program were made on September 2, 2010. The Ozarks Regional YMCA-Walking School Bus Pilot Program, Ozark R-VI School District-Safe Routes to School, Greene County-Bicycle Destination Plan Phase I, Springfield-Greene County Park Board-South Dry Sac Greenway, Springfield-Greene County Park Board-Wilson Creek Greenway Phase III and Springfield-Greene County Park Board-Fassnight Creek Greenway Trail, The Republic R III School District Bicycle/Walking Program and City of Nixa Walking School Bus programs were moved from the prior year's TIP to the current TIP. The final revision was to increase City of Nixa-Gregg Road and Route 14 Intersection project by 14.99%.

Ms. Edwards stated the modifications were administrative changes in lieu of TIP amendments. The modifications were reduced to seven because the Republic R III School District Bicycle/Walking Program and City of Nixa Walking School Bus got their funds obligated this week leaving the remaining project funds to be rolled into the new TIP. The remaining projects have not had their funds obligated into the current fiscal year

which ends September 30, 2010. Ms. Edwards stated this can be done administratively along with the City of Nixa – Gregg Road and Route 14 Intersection increasing the total project by 14.99%.

#### C. OTO Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Update

Mr. Conklin advised that everyone should have received an email of the September 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting at 9:00 am to move forward on the Long Range Transportation Plan. The timeline for the LRTP is as follows:

In September, OTO is planning to meet with the LRTP Subcommittee, review prioritization criteria, request projects for inclusion and select visualization projects. October, OTO plans to prioritize project submittals to review with the LRTP Subcommittee, review the visualization of a proposed project for each community. In November, OTO plans to review the draft and travel demand model for 2035 planned improvements. In December, OTO plans to continue to review the draft. In January, OTO plans to continue the draft review and schedule regional public meetings. In February, OTO will finalize the draft, schedule regional public meetings with a 30 day public comment period. In March, OTO will create a draft to present to the Technical Planning Committee for recommendations to the Board of Directors. In April, OTO will create a draft to present to the Board of Directors for Final Approval.

Ms. Sara advised the Technical Committee that OTO went out for visualization RFP for seven streets within the region which was awarded to Olsson.

#### D. Enhancement Funding Handbook and Application

Ms. Edwards stated that at the last Technical Planning Committee Meeting an Enhancement Subcommittee was created to evaluate applications submitted to OTO. There is \$1.6 Million in Enhancement Funding available. MoDOT placed a mandatory deadline which required an accelerated project delivery timeline. According to MoDOT regulations, projects must be selected by January 2011. The Enhancement Subcommittee will evaluate the necessary criteria in selecting projects to submit to the current Technical Planning Committee to be approved by the following Technical Planning Committee in 2011. The Enhancement Subcommittee met on August 27 to review the selection criteria. Changes can be reviewed in the Enhancement Funding Handbook.

A motion was made by Mr. Brock to forward the recommendations to the Board of Directors for adoption of the 2010 Enhancement Funding Handbook and Application. The motion was seconded by Mr. Watts. The motion was approved unanimously.

#### E. Update on EPA Review of Ozone Standards and Impact to OTO

EPA postponed the announcement of the new ozone standards from August 31, 2010 to the end of October 2010. OTO staff will update the Technical Planning Committee on the latest information from EPA and Missouri DNR.

EPA told Missouri DNR the same 2008 boundary explanation for nonattainment areas will be used for the 2011 designation. Missouri DNR also informed OTO that

2010 data will be used in the designation process. The Missouri DNR planned meetings for Springfield were pushed back until the new value is announced by EPA in October. The region's current design value for 2007-2009 is 69 ppb.

F. The Education and Medicaid Funding for States Act – BRO Rescission
The Education and Medicaid Funding for States Act rescinded \$2.2 billion of highway contract authority to help fund a \$26 billion package for teacher jobs and state Medicaid costs. For Missouri, \$51,812,722 was rescinded with approximately 9% coming from local programs and 91% from MoDOT programs.

#### III. Other Business

#### A. Technical Planning Committee Member Announcements

Ms. Gardner advised of a dedication for Highway 65, is scheduled for September 28<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 pm. The Advanced Traffic Management Projects will begin in the next 2-3 weeks.

Mr. Pat Lloyd called the meeting to order at 1:35 p.m.

#### I. Administration

#### A. Approval of Technical Committee Meeting Agenda

Carol Cruise made the motion to approve the Technical Committee Agenda and the motion was seconded by Frank Miller. The agenda was approved unanimously.

### B. Public Comment Period None.

#### II. New Business

#### A. MoDOT Cost Share Application Prioritization Process

The main purpose of the economic development/cost share program is to facilitate economic development with our area. MoDOT District 8 requested OTO approve the cost share application prioritization process that would be utilized to prioritize cost share applications in the OTO area. OTO currently has six applications that were submitted on October 5<sup>th</sup> for statewide cost share funding. MoDOT Central Office requested each district office prioritize projects within their district. It is District 8's goal to fund all projects submitted.

Mr. Frank Miller presented the cost share application prioritization process to the Technical Planning Committee explaining that MoDOT District 8 is proposing a tiered classification for economic development projects. The first tier reflects economic development projects with all other projects placed into a second tier. The process is a numbering system based on the number of jobs created, the priority given by OTO, and a functional needs score showing whether the projects meets a taking care of the system need. OTO prioritizes a project based on where it appears in the Long Range Transportation Plan. The functional needs score is based on MoDOT's internal prioritization process, which evaluates the project based on other factors such as congestion relief, economic competiveness, and quality of communities. Projects can accumulate additional scoring if it addresses taking care of the system (TOCS). An example of this would be if the project provides new pavement where a resurfacing is scheduled or where a bridge is in need of repair or replacement. An economic development project will get funding first and cost share projects second. The maximum funding that can be requested is fifty percent of the project.

Mr. Miller explained MoDOT District 8 went approximately three quarters without submitting a funding project application to the MoDOT Central Office in Jefferson City. The last submission was for five projects with only one being selected based on the priority ranking given by District 8. Mr. Miller stated the next MoDOT meeting will be in November. Mr. Miller stated the proposed process is a MoDOT District 8 ranking process, not OTO. MoDOT is looking for comments and concurrences. All non-OTO projects in District 8 will be placed within this ranking as well. This process will incorporate the current priority processes used by OTO and MoDOT.

The one selected was the Chestnut Expressway Railroad Overpass near Highway 65. The remaining four projects will be submitted this round in November with one addition being Evans/65 which is an economic development project. MoDOT reserves approximately \$5 million for economic development projects a year. An economic development project has an economic development/job development analysis from the Department of Economic Development's REMI Model. To be

classified the project must have a letter of support from DED stating the proposed development will create jobs within the State of Missouri improving the State's economy. In the job development analysis, DED will look at direct and indirect jobs created by the development. An economic development project will rank higher than a standard cost share project because of the profitable expansion created within the community.

Mr. Smith asked if the committee was approving a list or a process for funding. Mr. Miller and Ms. Edwards said the committee would be approving a MoDOT process. Currently, if approved, this process will be how the current listing will be categorized. The same process would be used in the future if multiple projects are needed at one given time.

Mr. Rognstad made a motion to present this process for approval to the Board of Directors. The motion was seconded by Ryan Mooney. The motion carried unanimously. Ron Effland and Frank Miller abstained because of their association with MoDOT.

#### III. Adjournment

Mr. Rognstad made a motion to adjourn the meeting and that was seconded by Mr. Gugel. The motion was approved unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned the meeting at 1:58 p.m.

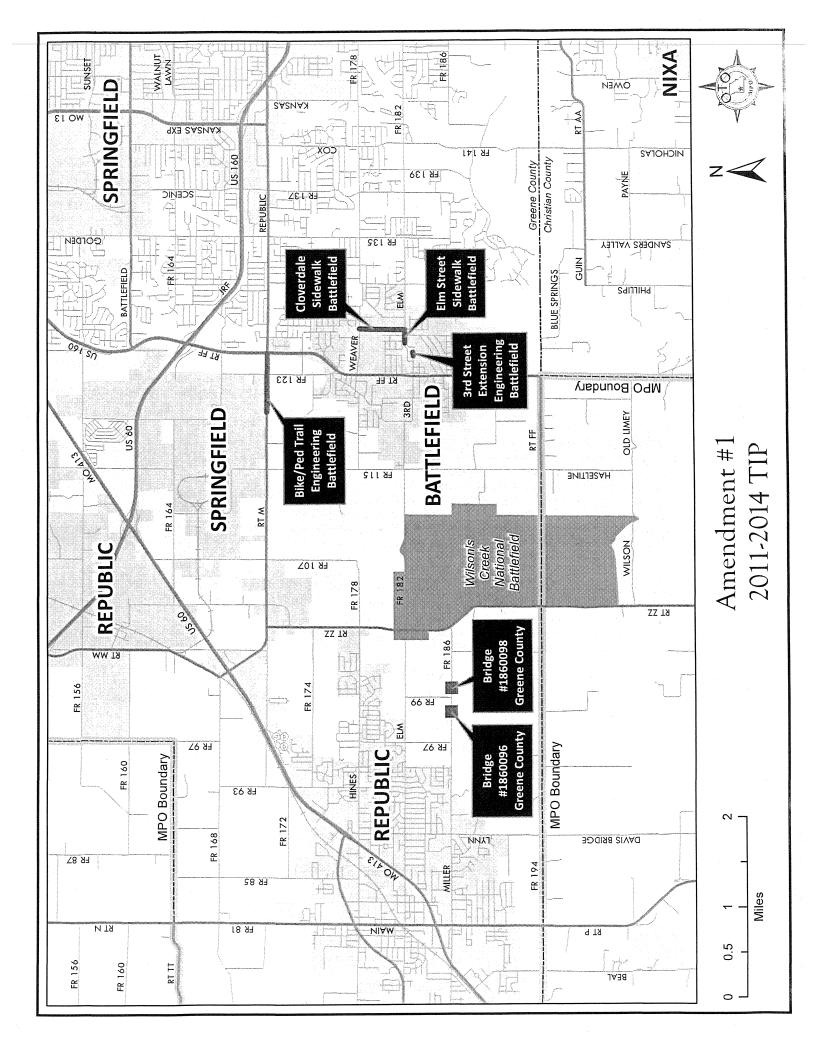

#### **Annual Listing of Obligated Projects (ALOP)**

### Ozarks Transportation Organization (Metropolitan Planning Organization)

**AGENDA DESCRIPTION:** Ozarks Transportation Organization is required by federal law to publish an Annual Listing of Obligated Projects:

§ 450.332 Annual listing of obligated projects. (a) In metropolitan planning areas, on an annual basis, no later than 90 calendar days following the end of the program year, the State, public transportation operator(s), and the MPO shall cooperatively develop a listing of projects (including investments in pedestrian walkways and bicycle transportation facilities) for which funds under 23 U.S.C. or 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 were obligated in the preceding program year. (b) The listing shall be prepared in accordance with § 450.314(a) and shall include all federally funded projects authorized or revised to increase obligations in the preceding program year, and shall at a minimum include the TIP information under § 450.324(e)(1) and (4) and identify, for each project, the amount of Federal funds requested in the TIP, the Federal funding that was obligated during the preceding year, and the Federal funding remaining and available for subsequent years. (c) The listing shall be published or otherwise made available in accordance with the MPO's public participation criteria for the TIP.

Included for review and consideration is the Ozarks Transportation Organization Fiscal Year 2010 Annual Listing of Obligated Projects.

Staff is requesting each jurisdiction review the report for any inaccuracies and advise staff. Please note that this is required to be published by December 30, 2010.

TECHNICAL COMMITTEE ACTION REQUESTED: To make a recommendation to the Board of Directors regarding the Annual Listing of Obligated Projects. If recommended for approval, include the following: That staff prepare a press release pursuant to the MPO's public involvement process so that a 15-day public review period for the list can be conducted and comments received prior to the December 16th Board of Directors meeting.
