Mr. Steve Childers called the January 16, 2008 Technical Planning Committee Meeting to order at 1:35 p.m.

I. Administration

A. Approval of Technical Committee Meeting Agenda

Ms. Cruise motioned to approve the agenda as presented. Mr. Smith seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

B. Approval of November 28, 2007 Meeting Minutes

Mr. Newman motioned to approve the minutes as presented. Mr. Atchley seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

C. Public Comment Period

Mr. Lambeth introduced Mr. Rick Hess as the new City Administrator for the City of Battlefield.

D. Staff Report

Ms. Edwards distributed a summary of public comments from the MoDOT 60 East meeting near Rogersville. The OTO office is beginning to look at the possibility of relocating to share office space with Missouri State University. The Regional Bike Summit is scheduled for February 8, 2008. The Safe Routes to School applications will be accepted starting February 1, 2008 and the deadline to submit is March 31, 2008. OTO is also looking for subcommittee volunteers. The subcommittees and volunteers are as follows:

TIP Subcommittee: Harry Price, Carol Cruise, Wally Schrock, Frank Miller, Duffy Mooney and Bob Atchley.

UPWP Subcommittee: Carol Cruise, Bill Robinett, Joel Keller, Ralph Rognstad and Jenni Jones.

LRTP Subcommittee: Dan Smith, Duffy Mooney, Steve Childers, David Hutchinson, Frank Miller and Wally Schrock.

II. New Business

A. MoDOT TIP Amendments

Mr. Miller stated that the Missouri Department of Transportation is requesting several TIP amendments. The first one is adjusting the federal funding to change the total project cost and subsequent funding shares of the Campbell and Weaver intersection improvement project to include the relocation of a natural gas pipeline. The Greene County and the City of Springfield costs are increasing to reflect this change. The amount of previous funding shown in the information packet should be \$1,308,000. That represents engineering and driveway acquisition. The total will be \$7,733,178. The next two projects are associated with Springfield Underground obtaining funding to widen East Kearney Street between the Highway 65 interchange and LeCompte Road. This project was awarded statewide economic development funds. Coupled with this is a bridge rehabilitation project that will be completed in conjunction with the Kearney Street widening. The final two requests are scoping projects. One is scoping to improve the Oakwood and US 60 intersection in Republic. The second is scoping to relocate the Bedford Avenue intersection on Highway D near Sam's Wholesale Club.

Mr. Mooney motioned to approve the TIP amendments. Mr. Newman seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

B. City of Springfield TIP Amendments

Mr. Newman stated that the City of Springfield is requesting TIP amendments to add an additional \$1,061,000 in enhancement funding. Mr. Martin Gugel from Public Works stated that the City of Springfield is requesting to reimburse the Federal Highway Administration \$1,061,000 that was spent for the construction of the Jordan Valley Car Park project in order to sell the structure to a private developer. The Jordan Valley Car Park project was awarded prior to enhancements funds being programmed by the OTO. These funds were originally MoDOT District 8 discretionary funds. It was decided by

FHWA and MoDOT that if the Jordan Valley Car Park was sold, these funds should be spent on other enhancement projects within the City of Springfield. The request is to decrease the local match and increase the federal share to equal 80% federal funding and 20% local funding on the Wilhoit Plaza Streetscape, Boonville Avenue Streetscape Phase IV and the Walnut Streetscape Phase III. The projects were originally a 50/50 local/federal split. Also three new projects will be added to the TIP, which were originally planned to utilize City of Springfield funds. These projects are the Campbell Underpass-Fassnight Creek Greenways, Campbell Avenue sidewalks and College Station Streetscape Phase IV. The Campbell Underpass is the underpass project that was applied for in 2007 by the City but not awarded in the last round of enhancements. The Campbell Avenue project is a currently funded (1/4 cent) sidewalk improvement project. This project will construct streetscape improvements on Campbell Avenue between Elm Street and Walnut Street. The College Station Streetscape Phase IV project is a currently funded (1/4 cent) sidewalk improvement project under design by Butler Rosenbury & Partners. This project will construct streetscape improvements on Campbell Avenue between McDaniel Street and Walnut Street, and on Olive Street between Market Avenue and Main Avenue. These projects are proposed to utilize federal enhancement funds.

Ms. Cruise motioned to approve the TIP amendments. Mr. Price seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

C. Executive Director Search Update

Ms. Edwards stated the Executive Director Search Subcommittee conducted two telephone interviews. The subcommittee would like to bring both applicants to Springfield for in-person interviews prior to the February Board of Directors Meeting. There will be a tour to some of the jurisdictions with each applicant. The formal interview process will be conducted that evening at dinner. At the February Board of Directors meeting, the Subcommittee will meet and try to make a decision whether one of the applicants will be accepted.

Mr. Childers inquired about background information on each applicant.

Ms. Edwards stated that one applicant is a District Planning Director in Minnesota in the area of Rochester. The second applicant is more of a broader City Administrator/ Planning Director position in Fayetteville, Arkansas.

III. Other Business

A. Technical Committee Member Announcements

Mr. Whaley stated that the first Ozarks Regional Bicycle Summit will take place on February 8, 2008 in Springfield. Jim Anderson will be the keynote speaker.

B. Transportation Issues For Technical Committee Member Review

Mr. Smith stated that during a meeting with area legislators about the Top 5 Priority Projects within the OTO area, there is already funding for most of the projects. The I-44/US 65 is under traffic. This is only phase one and phase two, not the total project. If understood correctly, MoDOT doesn't think the other phases will be needed for ten to

fifteen years. Should this project be taken off, modifying the Top 5 Priority Projects list?

Mr. Childers asked if there should be a subcommittee formed to discuss this previous to the next Technical Committee meeting?

Mr. Smith stated that at one time it was defined that a project was complete when it is under traffic. An example would be the airport access road. This project has full funding, so should there be another project added to the list to look for additional funding? One cautionary note from a legislator was not to get too far ahead of them or that could end up causing some problems. OTO will want to avoid a funding scenario where a currently funded project on the TIP will have to be removed and replaced with something else. No one wants the planning process to be skewed.

Mr. Price motioned to form a subcommittee for this issue. Ms. Cruise seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

Priority Projects Subcommittee members are: Steve McIntosh, Stacy Burks, Dan Smith, Harry Price, Steve Childers, Brian Bingle, Wally Schrock and Frank Miller.

Mr. Hutchinson stated that the City of Springfield is likely to have a couple of major thoroughfare plan adjustments for a future meeting.

Mr. Miller stated he had a follow-up on functional classification and urban boundaries. Statewide it was decided to update this. The updates need to be completed by February 15, 2008. There has to be a two page summary on each change, and there are a couple hundred to do. MoDOT may be contacting some jurisdictions regarding this. The Plainview, Third Street, Elm Street, FR 182 corridor through Springfield, Battlefield and Republic has been approved as a minor arterial.

City Utilities TIP Amendments

Ozarks Transportation Organization (Springfield, MO Area MPO)

AGENDA DESCRIPTION: City Utilities is requesting to amend the 2005-2007 TIP to add four projects, which better reflect the actual funds expenditure. The Federal Transit Administration requested an amendment to add the short range-planning project in order to utilize these funds to develop a conceptual plan for the Transit/Fleet Management complex located on Boonville north of Division. Improvements are needed in order to accommodate larger buses. These larger buses will include both front and rear doors for passenger loading and expedite the passenger loading and unloading times.

The remaining projects include the Renovation of the Transit/Fleet Management Facility, Bus Barn & Bus Transfer Facility Improvements and Bus Shelter and Bench Maintenance. These projects were intended to be added in 2005 when it was determined that instead of purchasing new paratransit buses, the existing buses could be refurbished. The remaining funds were and are being used for the projects as described in the amended TIP pages.

TECHNICAL COMMITTEE ACTION REQUESTED: To make a recommendation to the Board of Directors on amending the TIP to include the City Utilities requested TIP amendments. If recommended for approval, include the following: That staff prepare a press release pursuant to the MPO's public involvement process so that a 15-day public review period for the TIP amendment can be conducted and comments received prior to the April Board of Directors meeting.

Seminole Street Major Thoroughfare Plan Amendments

AGENDA DESCRIPTION: The City of Springfield has requested an amendment of the Major Thoroughfare Plan in order to extend Seminole Street (aka Farm Road 152) to the west across West Bypass. This new intersection would be approximately one half mile from the Sunshine (Highway 60) intersection with West Bypass and almost three quarters of a mile from the Farm Road 156 intersection. The spacing requirement in the Design Standards is one half mile for full access intersections. Therefore, this requirement is being met.

There is also a minor realignment of the Farm Road 129 extension that is accompanying the request. This relocation is allowing for greater distance between the Seminole/West Bypass intersection and the Seminole/Farm Road 129 intersection.






Proposed Major Thoroughfare Plan Amendment Seminole

AGENDA DESCRIPTION: The City of Springfield has requested an amendment of the Major Thoroughfare Plan in order to extend Battlefield Road to the west across West Bypass and across Sunshine (US60) to join with Farm Road 115. Currently, Battlefield Road intersects with West Bypass and joins Kaufmann Road to the west. The request is to extend Battlefield as a primary arterial. As part of the extension the intersection of Farm Road 115 with Farm Road 156 will be relocated to the north, which is further from US60. An outer road system is also being added to the north, which will connect the Farm Road 119 extension (collector) with Farm Road 115. On the south side of Sunshine (US60) a new intersection of Battlefield with Farm Road 115 will be created. This will allow for the closure of both the Farm Road 115 and Farm Road 156 intersections with Sunshine.

These Major Thoroughfare Plan amendments are all part of the West Sunshine/Hwy 60 Corridor Study. The request is being made today due to development pressure in the area. The remaining amendments precipitated by the study will be brought forward at a later date.






Proposed Major Thoroughfare Plan Amendment Battlefield



Consideration of the Unified Planning Work Program for FY09

Ozarks Transportation Organization (Springfield, MO Area MPO)

AGENDA DESCRIPTION: Each year, the MPO staff is required to develop a Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The UPWP spells out the activities, including plans and programs, the MPO will undertake during the fiscal year. Work tasks include administration, corridor planning, ridesharing, transportation planning, transit planning, and special studies.

For FY07, total expenditures are expected to be \$641,076 and available funds and in-kind contributions of \$641,076. This includes state and federal planning funds of \$430,000, \$90,761 in City of Springfield match, \$10,000 in-kind office space contribution and \$7,815 in-kind legal and financial services contribution (20% match requirement). There are \$469,756 available in state and federal planning funds. The City of Springfield is unable to provide the entire match needed this year to take advantage of this funding in its entirety. Therefore, \$39,756 will not be utilized in this year. However, we will be allowed to carry these funds over to future years.

Included in the UPWP for next year are six tasks: administration, general planning and plan implementation, transportation improvement program (development), rideshare and commuter choice program, transit planning, and special studies. Highlights for the UPWP include an expanded rideshare program, a new Transportation Improvement Program format, Air Quality planning, and the continuation of Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan Implementation. As usual a large part of the work program include administration, committee support, Long Range Transportation Plan implementation and maintenance and project programming.

SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION: The UPWP Subcommittee reviewed and recommended the UPWP to the full Technical Committee for recommendation to the Board of Directors.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: To recommend the UPWP for approval by the MPO Board of Directors.

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Introduction

The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is a description of the proposed activities of the Ozarks Transportation Organization during FiscalYear 2009 (July 2008 - June 2009). Task 020 - General Planning and Plan Implementation

Objective

This task addresses annual amendments and modifications to the Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), the Congestion Management Process (CMP) as well as the implementation of related plans, and policies. Currently, the Ozarks Transportation Organization's LRTP and CMP are compliant with the requirements of SAFETEA-LU.

Work Elements

The following items will be undertaken as part of this task:

- <u>Amendments to the Updated Long-Range Transportation Plan.</u> This work element focuses on maintaining a Long-Range Plan for the Springfield MPO that meets federal requirements for a constant 20-year plan horizon and financial constraint. Tasks include:
 - Process any proposed LRTP amendments.
 - Process any Major Thoroughfare Plan amendments
 - Complete public involvement for LRTP amendments.
 - Facilitate Board of Directors adoption.

Estimated Cost \$ 29,500

- Continuation of Phase III of Congestion Management Process. The Congestion Management Process (CMP) document is a federal requirement that must be undertaken by the Springfield Area MPO. The CMP consists of three main parts. Phase One defined the CMP network and specific strategies to address recurring congestion. Phase Two identified where congestion is occurring or is expected to occur during the twenty-year plan horizon and recommended which strategies will be used to address congestion at those locations. Phase III will involve monitoring of the system and tracking the effectiveness of selected strategies. Tasks include.
 - Gathering data to be used in the determination of effectiveness.
 - Gathering new data to ensure that congested facilities are identified as soon as possible.
 - Analyzing Data to determine congested corridors and intersections.
 - Analyzing data to determine effectiveness of selected strategies.
 - Mapping Data to illustrate congestion.

Estimated Cost \$ 30,000. NOTE: It is assumed that MoDOT and/or City of Springfield Traffic Engineering will provide traffic counts, crash statistics, and travel time runs as needed without direct cost to the MPO.

• <u>Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan Implementation.</u> The Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee has undertaken the implementation and update of the OTO Area-Wide Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan. The Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan is a three-phase plan. Phase I is the Bicycle Plan, Phase II is a Pedestrian Plan near schools and Phase III is a region-wide pedestrian plan. The completed plan was adopted by the Board in December of 2005.

- <u>Transportation Model.</u> The existing traffic model has been revised to include areas added to the MPO boundaries since 2000 as well as converting the modeling platform that is compatible with existing MPO GIS systems. Included in the funding is money for the model consultant to contract out any model runs requested by local jurisdictions to determine impacts of major new developments.

• <u>Geographic Information Systems (GIS).</u> Continue developing the Geographic Information System (GIS) and work on inputting data into the system that will support the Transportation Planning efforts.

Estimated Cost \$27,000

- Regional ITS Architecture. Review Regional ITS Architecture to determine how best it should be updated to comply with the five year update cycle required by federal legislation. Estimated Cost \$13,500
- <u>Air Quality Planning.</u> Staff serves on the Ozarks Clean Air Alliance Committee along with Springfield Greene-County Health Department which is formulating the first regional Clean Air Action Plan in hopes to preempt designation as a non-attainment area for ozone. Estimated Cost \$13,000

Task 030 - Transportation Improvement Program

Task 050 - Transit Planning

Objective

Prepare plans to provide efficient and cost-effective transit service for transit users.

Work Elements

A. Operational Planning.

- MPO Staff shall support operational planning functions including, surveys and analysis of headway and schedules, and development of proposed changes in transit services.
- Training and development.
- City Utilities Transit participation in MPO meetings and submittal of TIP program.
- City Utilities Transit grant submittal and tracking.
- City Utilities and MPO development of information for triennial reviews.
- City Utilities Transit collection and analysis of data required for the National Transit Data Base Report. Occasionally MPO Staff provide information toward this report, such as the data from the National Transit Database bus survey.
- City Utilities Transit and MPO will conduct marketing and customer service programs.
- City Utilities Transit studies about management, operations, capital requirements and economic feasibility, when needed.
- City Utilities Transit participation in Ozarks Transportation Organization committees and related public hearings.
- City Utilities Transit, often with MPO Staff assistance, forecast future transit costs.
- City Utilities Transit, MSU and MPO Staff collection and reporting of data required for the National Transit Database survey, conducted every three years.
- City Utilities Transit collection of data required to implement the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act and non-discriminatory practices. (FTA Line Item Code 44.24.00)
- MPO Staff and agencies work together on the MPO transit subcommittee.
- Community involvement to include work on committees, presentations, etc.
- MPO Staff coordination with City Utilities and MSU transit operations staff on any other task not specified herein.

B. ADA Accessibility.

- MPO Staff to work with City Utilities Transit staff on transportation improvements at bus stops (i.e. bus turnouts).
- City Utilities Transit retains contract management for ADA projects with MPO staff assistance as requested.
- MPO Staff and City Utilities Transit to work together on efforts to provide curb cuts and sidewalk accessibility at bus stops and shelters around Springfield, on an annual basis. (FTA Line Item Code 44.24.00)

C. Service Planning.

- As recommended by the Transit Development Plan (TDP), MPO staff lead in developing a strategic plan to create a stand-alone transit agency with taxing authority in preparation for a voter referendum.

- Per the TDP, City Utilities Transit and some MPO Staff assistance in the evaluation of existing routes, route segments, and services by performance criteria.

- MPO Staff collection of data from paratransit operations as required.
- MPO Staffing of the Local Coordinating Board for Transit that focuses on improving service in the community.
- City Utilities Transit development of route and schedule alternatives to make services more efficient and cost-effective. (FTA Line Item Code 44.23.01)
- MPO Staff and City Utilities Transit participation in special transit studies.

D. <u>Financial Planning</u>.

- City Utilities Transit analysis of transit system performance by adopted policies to achieve effective utilization of available resources.
- City Utilities Transit preparation of long and short-range financial and capital plans.
- MPO Staff to cooperate with Missouri State University and City Utilities in the development and implementation of their Transportation Improvement Program projects.
- City Utilities Transit and MSU will study and produce planning justification for transit projects to be included in the TIP using standard planning practice.
- City Utilities Transit will identify possible cost-saving techniques and opportunities to meet future operating deficit and capital costs.
- City Utilities Transit, with potential assistance from MPO Staff, will identify potential revenue from non-federal sources to meet future operating deficit and capital costs. (FTA Line Item Code 44.26.84)

E. Competitive Contract Planning.

- City Utilities Transit will study opportunities for transit cost reduction through the use of third-party and private sector providers.
- Missouri State University will continue to monitor costs of their third-party private sector transit contractor.
- City Utilities Transit and MPO Staff will study potential coordination of private sector transportation with the existing and potential public sector providers to minimize unserved populace.
- MPO Staff to maintain a list of operators developed in the transit coordination plan for use by City Utilities (CU) and other transit providers in the development of transit plans.
- MPO Staff to cooperate with MSU, CU, and their consultants in the evaluation of existing services.

G. <u>Safety, Security and Drug and Alcohol Control Planning.</u>

- The MPO, City Utilities and Missouri State University have adopted policies of drug-free awareness programs to inform their employees on the dangers of drug abuse. (FTA Line Item Code 44.26.82) Funding is intended to assist in the development of a drug and alcohol awareness program in an effort to provide a drug and alcohol-free working environment for the employees at City Utilities, and MSU transit. In particular, special studies addressing critical transportation and related drug and alcohol issues may need to be completed.
- The MPO, City Utilities and MSU will review existing plans and procedures for maintaining security on existing transit facilities and take steps to mitigate any identified shortcomings.

Priority Project Selection

Ozarks Transportation Organization (Springfield, MO Area MPO)

AGENDA DESCRIPTION: The Ozarks Transportation Organization maintains a list of priority projects for the region. These priority projects represent those that are submitted to legislators each year for earmark consideration. These projects also represent those that are submitted to MoDOT for scoping and for project development. Finally, this list serves as a list used to submit to the state legislature for consideration of inclusion into a statewide transportation-funding package.

OTO currently has a Top 5 list of Priority Projects. Phase I of the I-44/65 project is complete and Phase II will not be needed for 10 to 15 years. So, it should be removed from the list for the time being. The Multimodal Corridor to the New Airport Terminal is designed and will be soon be under construction. The Glenstone/Republic Road and James River Freeway Interchange is under construction. The Federal Highway Administration has already obligated funds for these projects and no additional earmarks can be applied to them. It is for this reason, staff feels that additional projects should be selected.

Priorities

- U.S. 60 and U.S. 65 Interchange (including at-grade rail crossing on James River Freeway)
- U.S. 65 and I-44 Interchange
- Glenstone/Republic Road and James River Freeway Interchange
- Development of Multi-Modal Corridor(s) to New Airport Terminal
- Upgrade of U.S. 65 to a six-lane facility from I-44 to Highway 14
