Several roadways have proposed changes to their federal functional classification. The Federal Functional Classification System designates Federal Aid Highways, which are eligible for federal funding. The functional classification should match how the roadway is currently used. Roadways must have a minimum classification of Collector to be eligible for federal funding.

The following information is a summary of the submitted application materials.

Roadway Name – N 22nd St/N 21st St/Longview Rd/N 20th St

Current Functional Classification – Local

Requested Functional Classification – Major Collector

Roadway Name – S Madison Ave/N Farm Rd 231/E Farm Rd 112

Current Functional Classification – Minor Collector/Local

Requested Functional Classification – Major Collector

Major Thoroughfare Plan – Collector

Roadway Name – Hughes Road from Miller Rd to Hwy 160

Current Functional Classification – Local

Requested Functional Classification – Major Collector

Major Thoroughfare Plan – Collector/Future Collector
