B. Approval of the Technical Planning Committee Meeting Agenda

Mr. Cossey made the motion to approve the March 18, 2015 Technical Planning Committee meeting agenda. Mr. Hess seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

C. Approval of the January 21, 2015 Meeting Minutes

Mr. Martin made the motion to approve the January 21, 2015 Meeting Minutes. Mr. Brock seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

D. Public Comment Period for All Agenda Items

None.

E. Executive Director's Report

Ms. Fields mentioned that the EPA is looking to lower the Ozone standards between 60 parts per million (ppm) and 70 ppm. The OTO area was at 68 ppm. The Board approved a comment letter that was submitted, requesting that the EPA leave the standard alone or set it at 70 ppm, but not at the 65 ppm that the comments were requested on. If the standard stays at 70 ppm the region can avoid non-attainment.

Staff has been out at the City of Republic and City of Nixa for business expos and will be in the City of Ozark on March 28. The givemeyourinput.org website is up and running with the Long Range Transportation Plan Survey. There have been meetings of the Major Thoroughfare Plan Subcommittee to go with the Long Range Transportation Plan update. The design standards and road classifications are being reviewed. If there are any changes needed please let staff know.

The Transportation Section of the Community Focus Report for the City of Springfield and Greene County draft has been completed. The report is highlighting the funding shortfalls in the State of Missouri and the impact on the transportation system, as well as the transit funding shortfalls.

She mentioned that the new UPWP did not include a new FY 2016-2019 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP). The existing FY 2015-2018 TIP would stand. There are not a lot of projects because of the MoDOT funding crisis. There will be amendments to the current TIP. There will also be a mini update with the transit projects, since there will be some more transit funding available that has not been programmed yet. This will be the first time that this has happened, but it would be a lot of time and effort for a TIP that does not have changes.

F. MoDOT Update

Mr .Miller shared an update on MoDOT's 325 Plan. The Highway Commission has asked MoDOT to look at endorsing a gas tax that would go up 2 cents for 3 years for a total of 6 cents. This tax would then be indexed to the Consumer Price Index so it would raise if the rate of inflation goes up as well. The cities and counties would also get additional funding from this tax. A tax information handout had been distributed. The OTO area would receive approximately \$3.5 million. This would be in addition to the MoDOT funds that would restore the OTO area to the FY 2015 level. Right now the OTO's/MoDOT's funding will be down to \$6 million a year in 2018 without something being done. If there was a 6 cent gas

tax, plus the indexing that would put the region back up to about \$15 million a year to take care of the system. MoDOT would be able to make safety improvements, continue the ADA Transition Plan, and restore the Cost Share Program. There is even the possibility of small scale expansion or capacity improvements.

Overall, the OTO area system condition is good condition. There are not a lot of critical bridges, and the pavement is all on track. There are a lot of issues with lower volume routes statewide, not getting contract work. Now there will be supplementary routes not getting contract work. There is concern with bridges that are closing on the supplementary routes and not having a way to reopen. The handout shows the impact to the public. Once the tax reaches 6 cents, it would cost the average person approximately the amount of a gallon of milk a month. There is also a page in the handout that shows the difference between acting now or later. MoDOT is communicating with the Legislature to show it is an issue with the State. MoDOT would not be able to match federal funds in 2017. There needs to be action soon because if there is a delay next Legislative session, by the time the tax gets under way and the revenue collection starts, MoDOT will not be able to match funds.

Ms. Fields stated that there are four main points of passing the tax. MoDOT can maintain the system, the 325 system would no longer happen. There are only 6 roads in the OTO area that would be maintained under the 325 system plan. The federal funds would be matched. The Cost Share Program would be restored. There would be \$3.5 million that would go to cities and counties in the OTO area in addition to the \$9 million that MoDOT would receive, for a \$12.5 million of funding increase. It is a modest increase only about half of the proposed Amendment 7.

Mr. Miller stated that if the Federal Government passes a bill that provides more funding, that would not help the area out at this point, but the gas tax would give room for that. Mr. Haynes stated that in terms of advertising the tax, it seems to be missing Missouri's national ranking among the 50 states. He had heard that Missouri was ranked 42nd. Mr. Miller stated that Missouri was ranked 47th. There was discussion on the surrounding states gas strategies. Ms. Fields inquired if there was a list, since staff was going to write a letter for the Board to review. The letter would be sent to all the Representatives and Senators in Missouri. Mr. Miller thought there was a list. Mr. Haynes stated that the Institute of Transportation Engineers had started an Advocacy Committee. He gave information on the committee. He stated that advocacy is not to be confused with lobbying. Lobbying is asking the Legislature to vote a certain way, while advocacy is providing information and what would happen if votes are made one way or another.

G. Legislative Reports

Mr. Hough stated that there were no transportation relevant issues in the House at the moment. There was some talk in the Senate of repatriating foreign funds. It does not seem to be going anywhere. Ideally that is a proposal that would generate some funds for transportation.

A. Recognition of Kevin Lowe

Mr. Humphrey conducted a moment of recognition of Kevin Lowe. Mr. Martin, Ms. Fields, Mr. Artman, and Ms. Gallion shared memories of Kevin Lowe. A brief moment of silence was observed.

II. **New Business**

A. Administrative Modification 3 to the FY 2015-2018 TIP

Ms. Longpine stated that certain changes to the TIP could be made without going through the full approval process per the OTO's Public Involvement Policy. This Administrative Modification is for Jackson and Main Street sidewalks in the City of Willard. The STP-Urban was increased up to \$48,300 for the total project to be a little over \$60,000.

B. Amendment Number Four to the FY 2015-2018 TIP

Ms. Longpine stated that there was a handout with changes to the amendment. The first two projects were originally in the agenda as one item. The City of Battlefield is looking to do sidewalks on both Weaver Road and FF. That will be over both this year and next year. The City of Battlefield has also requested to remove the 3rd Street Extension from the TIP.

There is a request from the City of Republic to use STP-Urban funds to design and construct corridor improvements along Oakwood and Hines in the amount of \$2.4 million. The last two amendments are related to the City of Springfield. There is a letter handed out regarding the projects. The Jordan Creek Trail at West Meadows had been awarded 2013 TAP funding. It turns out there are some liability concerns with the project. It was determined it would be best to hold off on the project and put funding elsewhere. It is proposed that the \$240,000 from the West Meadows Trail be used on the College and Broadway Pedestrian Plaza. Mr. Miller asked if that was dollar for dollar. Ms. Longpine stated that there was \$250,000 on College Street and that the City was comfortable with the additional \$10,000. Mr. Martin confirmed that the City of Springfield was asking for \$240,000.

Mr. Martin made the motion to recommend for approval of TIP Amendment Number Four to the FY 2015-2018 TIP to the Board of Directors. Mr. Brown seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

C. Public Participation Plan Amendment

Mr. Boley stated that the amendment was to satisfy City Utilities Transit and Federal Transit Administrations requirements for the grant. On Page 17 of the Public Participation Plan there was a striking of the paragraph that requires City Utilities to set up their own public participation requirements. It has been restated to say that the OTO would satisfy this requirement for City Utilities programs. The proposed changes also show that OTO will conduct the project selection process and select projects for public transportation in the OTO area for all federal public transportation funding. The Public Participation Plan will satisfy the TIP Amendments for the programming of projects as well.

Ms. Fields stated that this is not a change to what the OTO currently does, just the documentation of what is currently being done. The OTO is doing the things that have always been done, it was just not in writing when FTA reviewed the paperwork.

Mr. Martin made the motion to recommend for approval of the Public Participation Plan Amendment to the Board of Directors. Mr. Brock seconded and the motion was carried unanimously.

D. OTO Growth Trends Report

Mr. Guthrie presented the OTO Growth Trends Report. The report covers the member jurisdictions in the five county MSA, which includes Christian, Dallas, Greene, Polk and Webster Counties. The report is created through the use of US Census data and also permit data provided by the municipalities.

E. FY 2016 Unified Planning Work Program

Ms. Fields stated that the OTO is required by federal law to prepare a Unified Planning Work Program that outlines the work for the upcoming year. The fiscal year is July 1 through June 30. Overall the budget is smaller. There will not be a new TIP so there are some savings there. The Travel Demand Model has been completed. The Bluetooth project is also projected to be completed in the current fiscal year. Mr. Haynes stated that the City of Springfield had also budgeted for the Bluetooth in the current year.

Ms. Fields outlined the tasks included in the UPWP. She pointed out some key items. There was an increase in the public involvement category for several reasons. Staff plans to get out more in the community. The OTO joined several Chambers of Commerce in addition to the City of Springfield Chamber and will be attending Expos. There is some promotional material for the giveusyourinput.org site. Staff is trying to ramp up public involvement and is gathering public input for the Long Range Transportation Plan. Ideally the plan will be completed by the end of 2015. It is not required by law to be accomplished until the end of 2016. There will be a CMP update in 2016 with the Bluetooth data.

The Aerial Photography was left out on accident so it has been added into the UPWP. The City of Springfield coordinates an effort to buy aerial photography for the area. The OTO anticipates putting in \$40,000 for the effort. There are not final numbers yet, but it is projected to be approximately \$200,000. Through the consortium group the OTO members receive a discount. The OTO's \$40,000 offsets some of the flights price. The discount covers the transportation planning aspects that the aerial photography are used for even though the photography is also used for other purposes.

Ms. Fields stated that there will also be a solicitation for transit applications. There are still some funds available for transit projects, principally the FTA 5310 vehicles, since there was not enough application to cover the FY 2014 funds. There are now FY 2015 funds. Staff has been working with MoDOT to coordinate the applications. There are a few typos in the UPWP document that state FY 2016-2019 TIP. The typos are being corrected. There will not be a FY 2016-2017 TIP. Work will start next summer on the FY 2017-2020 TIP. There will also be TIP amendments and the federal funds will still be tracked. The TIP Online Tool will also remain operational.

Task 060 was split out this year so OTO is at the beginning and the next part is City Utilities Transit planning activities. It is not very different from other work programs throughout the years. If anyone has a project that they would like done there is a little spot for special studies.

Mr. Martin asked if there was any concern with having that much carryover balance. Ms. Fields stated that she calls MoDOT every year to verify their policy. The statewide policy has been and still is 5 years of funding. Mr. Martin stated that the justification is that the OTO is running a reimbursement program. Ms. Fields stated that the OTO does run a reimbursement program. Mr. Martin stated that even with special programs being added to it, it is still a pretty good carryover balance. Ms. Fields stated it is. She stated that the OTO has offered that at some point there could be an alignment study for one of the dotted lines on the map. There would have to be participation from the jurisdictions that are affected. But the carryover balance would allow that type of project to happen.

Mr. Hess made the motion to recommend approval of the FY 2016 UPWP to the Board of Directors. Mr. Martin seconded and the motion was carried unanimously.

F. Long Range Transportation Plan Subcommittee

Ms. Longpine stated that the Long Range Transportation Plan efforts had started and that staff was looking for a subcommittee to help guide the work. It would include reviewing all the surveys that are received. Also looking at the base data and looking at future year projections. The plan is to be performance based and hopefully short. She stated that Ms. Voss had volunteered to sit on the committee, though she was not able to attend the TPC meeting. Volunteers were requested from each jurisdiction.

Mr. Brock asked that when it says "the draft is expected to be done before next summer" is that summer of 2015 or 2016. Ms. Longpine stated 2016.

The following volunteered for the Long Range Transportation Plan Subcommittee, Adam Humphrey, Diane Gallion, Randall Brown, Eva Voss, Larry Martin, Travis Cossey, Dawne Gardner, Frank Miller, David Brock, Todd Wiesehan, and King Coltrin.

Mr. Brock made the motion to appoint David Brock, Randall Brown, King Coltrin, Travis Cossey, Diane Gallion, Dawne Gardner, Adam Humphrey, Larry Martin, Frank Miller, Eva Voss, and Todd Wiesehan, to the Long Range Transportation Plan Subcommittee. Mr. Haynes seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

III. **Other Business**

A. Technical Planning Committee Member Announcements

Ms. Gallion stated that City Utilities was opening the bids for the bus transfer station. It has been in the works since 2005, when the grant process was started. Ms. Fields inquired on the estimated cost. Ms. Gallion stated over \$5 million. She passed around a rendition of the bus transfer station to the committee. She stated that the building cost \$5,000 a square foot, but there was a lot of concrete and land movement in addition to the building. The City of Springfield was partnering with street scapes and bike lanes. There are also storm water improvements. It should help develop the area.

Mr. Haynes stated that Tom Ryan, the former District Traffic Engineer of MoDOT, was hired by MoDOT to look at the Transportation Management Center Operations and the future plans for connections to the surrounding communities including Joplin, Branson, and Lebanon. There is an Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Architecture Plan, which includes electronic signs, cameras, and networks. There is vehicle infrastructure integration, vehicle to vehicle integration, but the architecture plan defines a number of projects over the years that the region would be interested in participating and deploying. The goal is to have an ITS system that keeps up with the rest of the country. The Architecture Plan is updated every 5 years. Mr. Ryan is updating the plan for the region. The first plan was put together in 2001-2005. At that time there stakeholder meetings.

There were representatives from each community at those meetings, who presented the needs for active transportation management. Mr. Ryan will request an audience with the OTO members to talk about the plan, updates, and what the needs are in the communities. The City of Republic recently worked with MoDOT to get the Adaptive Signal System installed. He explained how ITS worked in the community.

Mr. McMahon stated that Mr. Haynes was correct, that the outreach is necessary and valuable. He mentioned that the City of St. Louis was in the process of updating their plan. He inquired if there was an outside consultant. Mr. Haynes stated that the update was fairly easy so Mr. Ryan would be preparing the update. He stated that there would be an integration with the MPO and the TIP to make sure the projects are in there. There was discussion on what types of projects and technology should be included in the ITS Plan. Mr. McMahon stated that each of the Local Public Agencies (LPAs) needed to be part of it to put it together.

Ms. Fields stated that there has been a problem with nailing down real dollar figures to projects. She suggested that be considered when writing the plan. Mr. Haynes agreed that he had the same trouble since technology prices could drastically decrease or remain high. Mr. Watts inquired if this was the first time the plan was extending outside the OTO area. Mr. Haynes stated that the original plan had projects that could be deployed in any community. There is technology now, so there needs to be communication with the stakeholders. Mr. Watts suggested using the RPC network to spread the word.

Mr. McMahon stated that the City of St. Louis had just wrapped up outreach workshops where representatives from the LPAs were all in the same room. He volunteered to supply copies of agendas and the outcome of those workshops. He inquired who the lead was on the ITS Architecture Plan. Mr. Haynes stated MoDOT. Mr. McMahon stated that the MPO needed to be involved. TMAs need to have the ITS architecture. He requested someone from the OTO be involved. Ms. Fields stated a staff member would and the OTO would be willing to host meetings. Ms. Fields stated that the OTO is also updating the CMP with the Long Range Transportation Plan. The ITS is a great way to build capacity into the system.

B. Transportation Issues for Technical Planning Committee Member Review None.

C. Articles For Technical Planning Committee Member Information

Ms. Longpine stated that a response letter had been received from MoDOT regarding the Tough Choices Ahead Program. There is also a summary of the Grow America Act Transportation Bill included. Mr. Brock stated that the letter from Mr. Dave Nichols is not really clear on what the original question was. Ms. Fields stated that when MoDOT came out with the 325 System Plan, OTO wrote a letter requesting to not let the funds go back, but to allow the OTO the opportunity to match the funds before returning the funds. This letter is the response to that. Mr. McMahon inquired what MoDOT had said. Ms. Fields stated that they did not want federal funds to go back but they were not anticipating letting the OTO match the funds. Mr. McMahon stated he thought MoDOT's position on that is that MoDOT had realized that some LPAs across the state were better off than others. There are some LPAs out there that could pick it up so the funds so the funds

would not be returned, but that would not solve the problem. MoDOT wants to stay focused on the problem holistically.

Mr. Martin made the motion to adjourn. Mr. Brown seconded and the meeting was adjourned at 2:35 p.m.

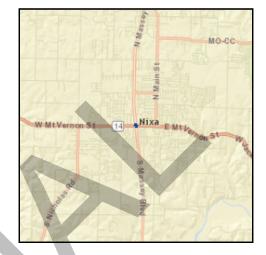

Federal Funds Balance Report - March 31, 2015

Ozarks Transportation Organization (Springfield, MO Area MPO)

AGENDA DESCRIPTION:

The Funds Balance Report included in the agenda is a snapshot of the federal funds balance for each funding program and each jurisdiction. This report only includes the federal allocation to date.

Federal funding has only been appropriated through May 31, 2015. This report reflects that appropriation. It is expected that Congress will appropriate funding through September 30th in the next few weeks. At that time, additional funding will be made available. In addition, it is expected that Congress will extend MAP-21 resulting in additional funding on October 1, 2015.

Please refer to Page vi for information on expected balances after October 1, 2015. This assumes full appropriations for FY 2015 and FY 2016.

BACKGROUND:

Ozarks Transportation Organization is allocated STP-Urban, Small Urban, and BRM (On-System Bridge) funds each year through MoDOT from the Federal Highway Administration. MoDOT has enacted a policy of allowing no more than three years of this STP-Urban allocation to accrue due to requirements by FHWA. If a balance greater than 3 years accrues, funds will lapse (be forfeited).

OTO has elected to sub-allocate the STP-Urban and Small Urban funds among the jurisdictions within the MPO area. Each of these jurisdiction's allocations are based upon the population within the MPO area. OTO's balance is monitored as a whole by MoDOT, while OTO staff monitors each jurisdiction's individual balance. When MoDOT calculates the OTO balance, it is based upon obligated funds and not programmed funds, so a project is only subtracted from the balance upon obligation from FHWA. OTO receives reports showing the projects that have been obligated. MoDOT's policy allows for any cost share projects with MoDOT that are programmed in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, although not necessarily obligated, to be subtracted from the balance. The next deadline to meet the MoDOT funds lapse policy is September 30, 2015.

Staff has included a report which documents the balance allowed, the balance obligated, and the balance that needs to be obligated by the end of the Federal Fiscal Year in order not to be rescinded by MoDOT. According to staff records, as a whole, OTO has obligated or has programmed in cost shares with MoDOT, funding exceeding the minimum amount required to be programmed for FY 2015, therefore, there is not an immediate threat of rescission by MoDOT. This report, however, does not include the full FY 2015 allocation, as Congress has only authorized funding through May 2015. Also, MoDOT has suspended the cost share program, so balances will accumulate at a much faster rate than they have in the past. OTO jurisdictions are reminded to be mindful of their balances, obligating funding as soon as is possible for projects.

The report also outlines activity in other OTO funding accounts, such as BRM, Small Urban, and the Transportation Alternatives Program. These accounts are subject to the same rescission policy.

The Obligation Summary Report Balance Sheet (Page 1) indicates the STP-Urban balance for OTO as a whole. OTO has an ending balance of \$17,015,383.61 as of March 31, 2015. After the MoDOT cost share projects that appear in the STIP are subtracted, the balance is \$7,232,166.54. This is well within the balance allowed to be carried by MoDOT.

In 2009, \$3.5 million in STP-Urban funding was rescinded when SAFETEA-LU expired, though it was restored nine months later. The only action that prevents a rescission of federal funding is obligation. The OTO unobligated balance of all funds that is subject to rescission is \$19,075,010.83. It is recommended that this funding be obligated as quickly as possible to protect against further rescissions. Several jurisdictions have partnered with MoDOT to spend these funds. OTO commends those who have acted in response to the suggestion that these funds be spent.

The Introduction also contains information regarding the FY 2015 and FY 2016 funding allocations.

FUNDS BALANCE REPORT

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Surface Transportation Program Funding

The federal surface transportation authorization legislation, MAP-21 (Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act), reauthorizes federal highway, transit, and other surface transportation programs through September 30, 2014. MAP-21 is a continuation of prior surface transportation authorization legislation including TEA-21, ISTEA, and others dating back to the first Federal Aid Highway Act of 1956.

The Surface Transportation Program (STP) funding is distributed to varying programs and public agencies for implementation of the authorizing legislation requirements. This distribution includes a specific allocation to urbanized areas over 200,000 by percentage of population. These urbanized areas are part of metropolitan planning areas, and more specifically, transportation management areas (TMAs). The Ozarks Transportation Organization (OTO) is the TMA for the Springfield, Missouri urbanized area.

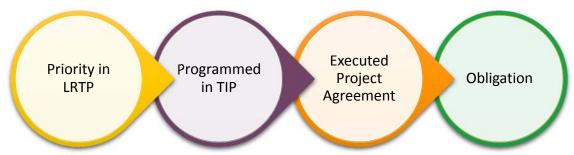
OTO is responsible for project selection, programming, reasonable progress, and the maintenance of fund balances for three subcategories of STP funding – Transportation Alternatives Program, On-System Bridge (BRM), and STP funding (both Urban and Small Urban). This report monitors the funding balance and obligations made by OTO member jurisdictions for this funding. OTO has been receiving sub-allocated funding since 2003.

Eligible Entities for OTO Suballocated STP Funds

- All cities and counties within OTO's metropolitan planning boundary
- All transportation corporations within OTO's metropolitan planning boundary
- Missouri Department of Transportation
- All public transit agencies within OTO's metropolitan planning boundary
- OTO

An obligation is a commitment of the federal government's promise to pay for the federal share of a project's eligible cost. This commitment occurs when the project is approved and the project agreement is executed. Obligation is a key step in financing and obligated funds are considered "used" even though no cash is transferred.

Obligating a Project



To ensure each jurisdiction has access to STP funding, OTO monitors how each OTO member utilizes available STP funding. Also, MoDOT has a statewide policy regarding the accumulation of STP funds, which is limited to a three year accrual. Committed cost share funds are allowed to count toward that balance. Any unobligated funding, however, is subject to rescission by Congress. The following report highlights the amount of funding which needs to be obligated to meet MoDOT's accrual policy, as well as the amount of funding subject to rescission by Congress.

Program Balances

OTO has elected to sub-allocate the STP-Urban and Small Urban funds among the jurisdictions within the MPO area. Each of these jurisdiction's allocations are based upon the population within the MPO area. OTO's balance is monitored as a whole by MoDOT, while OTO staff monitors each jurisdiction's individual balance. When MoDOT calculates the OTO balance, it is based upon obligated funds and not programmed funds, so a project is only subtracted from the balance upon obligation from FHWA. OTO receives reports showing the projects that have been obligated. STP-Urban

STP-Urban funding is a subcategory of the Surface Transportation Program consisting of funding that is directly suballocated to metropolitan planning areas with urbanized area populations over 200,000. The federal share for this funding is generally 80 percent, with some specific exceptions for certain Interstate and Safety projects. A variety of activities are eligible under this funding category provided the funding is spent on roads federally functionally classified as collector or higher, excepting bridges not on federal-aid highways and carpool, biking, pedestrian walkway improvements and other transportation alternatives also not on federal-aid highways. Rescission risk is identified as Moderate, since the lack of future programmed cost shares will cause the balance to rise quickly.

Small-Urban

The Small-Urban program is a subset of statewide STP funding, which is allocated to jurisdictions whose urbanized cluster or area population is greater than 5,000, but smaller than 200,000. The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission allocates \$3.5 million in surface transportation program funds annually to this small-urban program. Project eligibility is the same as that described under the STP-Urban program.

Currently, one OTO jurisdiction, the City of Republic, receives an allocation of Small-Urban funding. The amount of this funding is considered when determining the STP-Urban suballocation, ensuring that each jurisdiction receives the appropriate share of all available funding. There is a remaining balance from when Springfield qualified to receive Small Urban. Some funding has been de-obligated from a prior City of

Springfield/Greene County project, which has increased the amount in this account. The rescission risk has been raised to moderate with this influx of funds.

Bridge Rehabilitation and Maintenance

On-System Bridge Replacement and Rehabilitation Program (BRM) funding is not suballocated in the OTO area. Instead, a review committee is appointed that examines the eligible bridges for BRM funding, and in working with those jurisdictions and MoDOT, a selection is made for the use of that money.

This program funds the replacement or rehabilitation of deficient bridges located on roads federally functionally classified as urban collectors, rural major collectors, and arterials. Previously, this funding was a subcategory of the Highway Bridge Program under SAFETEA-LU, but MAP-21 discontinued the Highway Bridge Program. Highway bridges continue to be eligible under the Surface Transportation Program and the new National Highway Performance Program. The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission has allocated \$6.3 million of Surface Transportation Program funds annually during MAP-21 to the Transportation Management Areas (urbanized area over 200,000) of Kansas City, St. Louis, and Springfield. The funding is determined based upon the ratio of the replacement cost of the square footage of deficient bridge deck in the TMA to the replacement cost of the square footage of deficient bridge deck in all TMAs of the state.

Currently, one project is programmed using BRM funding. This funding, for the Battlefield/65 Interchange, has been obligated. Future allocations for this funding have not yet been determined. The rescission risk for this program has been set at Moderate, as MoDOT is prioritizing projects based on their location along primary routes, meaning use of this funding will likely fall to local jurisdictions.

Transportation Alternatives Program

The Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) is a new funding category under MAP-21. It encompasses Enhancements, Recreational Trails, and Safe Routes to School. Previously, the Enhancements were distributed by the Missouri Department of Transportation to the urban and rural areas of the state, while Safe Routes to School was a statewide process. With the changes in MAP-21, TAP funding is directly allocated to the OTO and other TMAs across the country. Federal law requires that each year's funding be obligated within three years of the initial allocation. This coincides with MoDOT's funds lapse policy, but there are not exceptions to the potential for rescission.

OTO has awarded TAP funding through FY 2016. The current balance only reflects allocations through FY 2015. With funding awarded in advance, however, obligations should stay ahead of future allocations. OTO awards TAP funding on a competitive basis and provides a Board of Directors approved application and scoring process to the OTO jurisdictions when funding is made available. For this reason, the rescission risk has been set to Low.

Summary

All funding that is not obligated continues to be subject to rescission by Congress. In 2009, \$3.5 million in STP-Urban funding was rescinded when SAFETEA-LU expired, though it was fortunately restored nine months later. The only action that prevents a rescission of federal funding is obligation. The OTO unobligated balance of all funds that is subject to rescission is \$15,307,342.47. It is recommended that this funding be obligated as quickly as possible to protect against further rescissions. Several jurisdictions have partnered with MoDOT to spend these funds. OTO commends those who have acted in response to the suggestion that these funds be spent. With the suspension of the MoDOT Cost Share Program, however, it will become more difficult for OTO jurisdictions and the OTO as a whole to meet MoDOT's Funds Lapse Policy, and continuing to leave all fund balances exposed to federal rescission.

Looking Ahead to FY 2016

On October 1 of each year, the Ozarks Transportation Organization receives a new allocation of funding for the next Fiscal Year. Due to continuing resolutions of MAP-21, OTO is unsure of the full federal fiscal year allocation for FY 2015. So far, only 8/12ths has been allocated. OTO encourages its member jurisdictions to be cognizant of future year funding allocations when considering funding balances subject to rescission.

An estimated amount subject to rescission for each jurisdiction has been estimated based upon an FY 2015 allocation similar to FY 2014. Though active cost shares continue to keep the entire OTO balance below MoDOT's Lapse Policy amount, each jurisdiction is encouraged to help minimize the OTO regional balance, especially as the cost share program continues to be indefinitely suspended.

Before the end of FY 2016, over \$3.5 million in STP-Urban funding may be subject to MoDOT's funds lapse policy. It is important that the STP-Urban funding that is programmed through FY 2016 be obligated as planned to prevent any future rescissions.

Ozarks Transportation Organization (Springfield, MO Area MPO)

AGENDA DESCRIPTION: Pursuant to §470.105.b listed below, the State of Missouri, in conjunction with OTO, must maintain a functional classification map. This map is different from the Major Thoroughfare Plan, which is part of the Long Range Transportation Plan. The Federal Functional Classification System designates Federal Aid Highways, i.e. those eligible for federal funding.

The following information is a summary of the submitted application materials.

The City of Strafford has requested the following change to the federal functional classification system. The application is included.

1) Washington Avenue, from OO to Bumgarner, with new alignment from Olive to Bumgarner Current Functional Classification – Local

Requested Functional Classification - Major Collector

Major Thoroughfare Plan – Collector

Reasoning – This is a proposed realignment of Washington that removes two 90-degree turns from the most used route for trips in Strafford south of OO.

OTO and MoDOT Staff are recommending the following additional functional classification changes to the Strafford area. MoDOT Central Office concurred with these recommendations as rounding out the functional classifications in the southern portion of Strafford.

2) Bumgarner, from Madison to Wrenwood

Current Functional Classification - Local

Requested Functional Classification - Major Collector

Major Thoroughfare Plan – Collector

Reasoning – This is also a heavily traveled roadway and brings the traffic of several neighborhoods to Madison/Washington and into Strafford.

3) Bumgarner, from Wrenwood to Farm Road 245, and Farm Road 245, from Bumgarner to OO Current Functional Classification – Local

Requested Functional Classification – Minor Collector

Major Thoroughfare Plan - Collector

Reasoning – This is the alternate route for those along Bumgarner to gain access to Strafford's commercial district.

4) Madison, from Bumgarner to Elm

Major Thoroughfare Plan – Collector

Reasoning – This route is a continuation of the most used access from the south of Strafford.

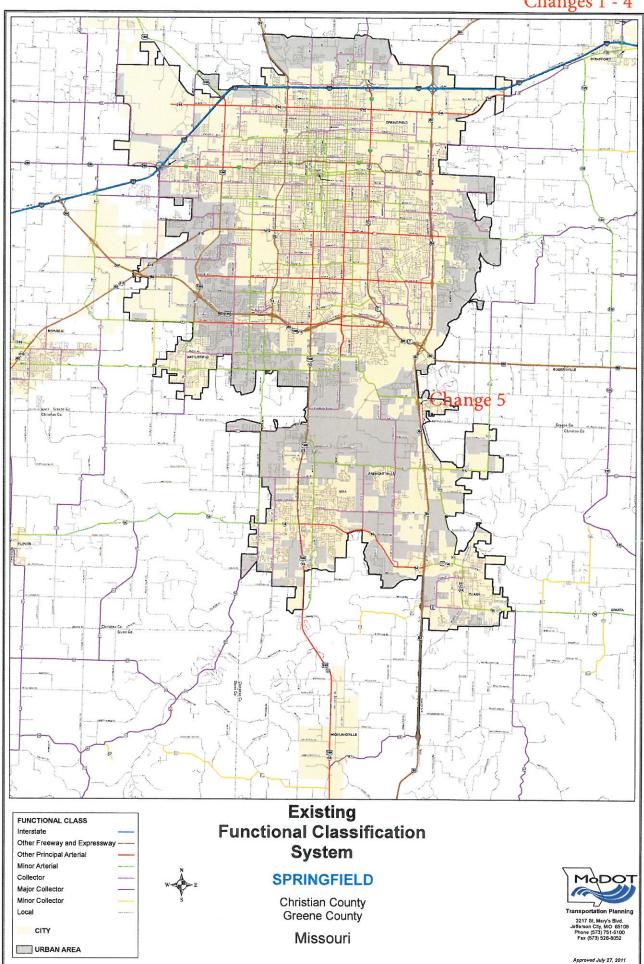

This new section of Washington Avenue would remove the trips that are currently using a combination of Washington,

Olive and Madison Streets to move to the south side of Strafford.

Over **90 percent** of the trips in Strafford going south of Route OO utilize this route. This route requires two 90 turns and traveling

streets that are on average 21 feet wide. The 90 degree turns present poor sight distance and therefore poor safety for these trips.

AASHTO defines Urban Collector Street as follows;

"The collector street system provides both land access service and traffic circulation within residential neighborhoods and

Commercial and industrial areas. It differs from the arterial system in that facilities on the collector system may penetrate

Residential neighborhoods, distributing trips from the arterials through the area to their ultimate destinations. Conversely, the

Collector street also collects traffic from local streets in residential neighborhoods and channels it into the arterial system. In

The Central business district, and in other areas of similar development and traffic density, the collector system may include

The entire street grid. The collector street system may also carry bus routes."

This defines exactly what Washington, Olive and Madison Streets are doing for the trips in Strafford. This route collects trips from local subdivision streets and moves them through to the arterial system of Route OO. Almost 3,000 daily trips is not an insignificant volume for a two lane street and is definitely more characteristic of a collector class roadway than a local roadway. The OTO Major Thoroughfare Plan has these roads classified as collectors.

Are there any new developments (residential or commercial) or changes in land usage that will alter the demand on this roadway?

Currently there are not but this portion of town is where the most recent residential subdivisions have occurred. There are two Preliminary Platted Subdivisions in this area of town. (Madison Square VI and Village Craft.

Will this roadway provide direct access to any points of activity: business parks, industries, shopping centers, etc?

This roadway connects the downtown business district, the schools and the City's largest park and most populous area together.

Is the demand on this roadway changing or is the existing demand inconsistent with its current classification?

The current number of trips are inconsistent with the classification and trips are increasing as well.

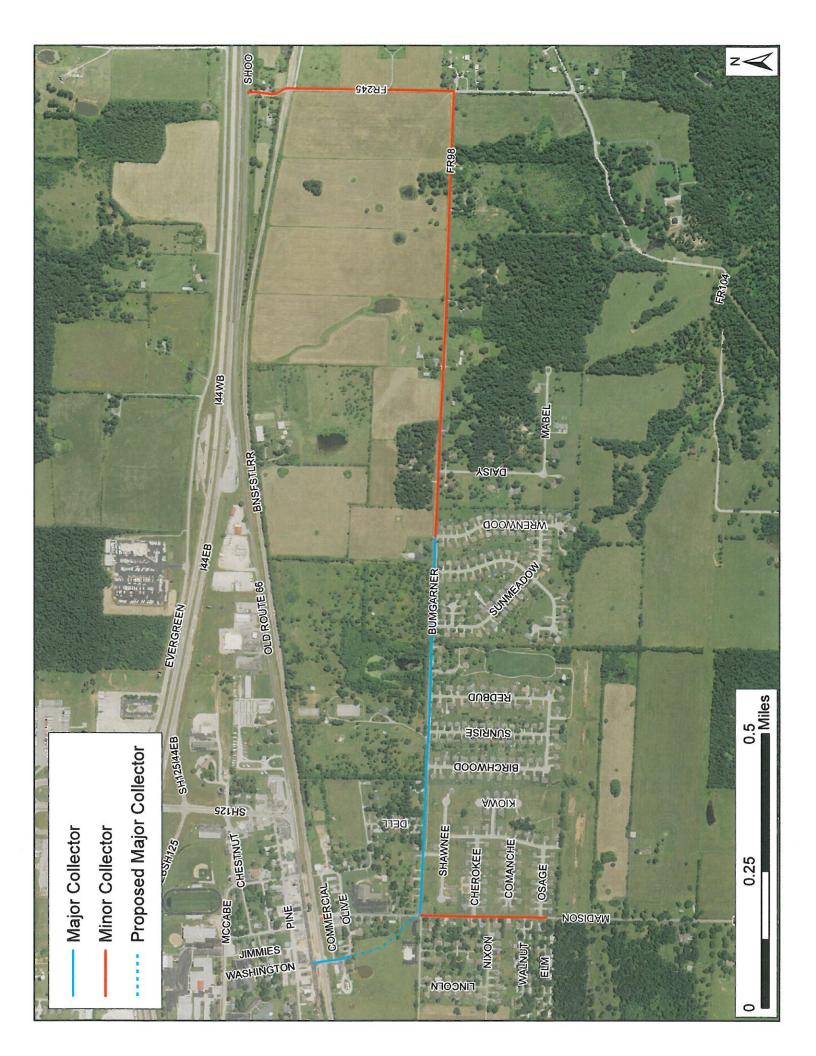

Functional Reclassification Process (minimum timeframe is 4 months)

- 1. Application. Applications are accepted at any time for a functional classification change. However, it will not be placed on the Technical Committee Agenda unless received at least two weeks prior to the meeting date. A general call for applications will be made annually in October.
- 2. Technical Committee. The request will be heard at the next available Technical Committee meeting. The Technical Committee will hear the item and make recommendation to the Board of Directors. The Technical Committee may decide to table the item until a future meeting.
- 3. **Board of Directors.** After a recommendation is made by the Technical Committee, the Board will approve or deny the request. If the request is approved, it will be forwarded to MoDOT and FHWA.

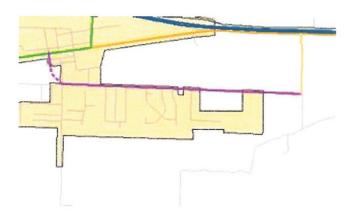

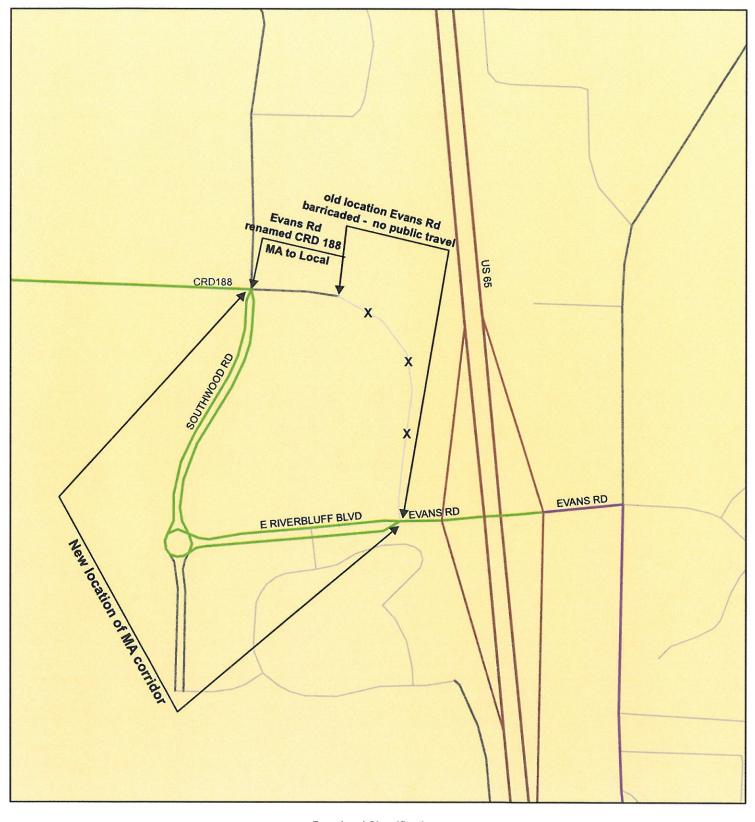

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AASHTO, AMPO Renew Decade-Old Plea for EPA to Accurately State 'Conformity' Costs

Organizations representing state departments of transportation and local-area planning agencies are trying to awaken federal officials to how EPA regulators greatly underestimate the costs they put on transportation agencies to show how their programs and projects conform with environmental law.

And in their latest official comments, the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials along with the Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations emphasized they have been repeatedly making this same point for more than a decade.

Meeting the EPA's conformity tests requires DOTs and MPOs to perform extensive analysis that involves data collection and modeling, both for an entire plan and later on individual projects under it. State and local officials say the federal agency does not recognize the burdens that process imposes, and that the EPA does not consult with them to assess the true costs.

In an April 24 letter to the head of the White House Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs, AASHTO and AMPO jointly responded to a Feb. 23 Federal Register request for comments on an EPA "transportation conformity information collection request."

The Register notice had explained that under the Clean Air Act, all transportation plans, improvement programs and highway or transit projects that are federally funded or approved must show conformity to the purpose of the state's air quality implementation plan.

That means they must show such transportation activities "will not cause or contribute to new air quality violations, worsen existing violations, or delay timely attainment of the relevant national ambient air quality standards ... or interim milestones," the notice said.

And those determinations "are required before federal approval or funding is given to certain types of transportation planning documents as well as non-exempt highway and transit projects."

AASHTO and AMPO said in their letter that the EPA has been demonstrating a big gap "between estimated conformity costs and actual conformity costs." They also attached a letter on this same issue that AASHTO submitted in 2004, and a joint AASHTO-AMPO comment letter from 2011.

They said the EPA, in its analysis of cost burdens for conformity requirements, "is using fundamentally flawed assumptions that result in significantly underestimated national conformity costs."

The associations said they "understand the challenges that EPA faces in developing cost estimates for the conformity process," but renewed past requests for the regulators to consult with state DOTs and MPOs to get more accurate results.

"As MPOs and DOTs are the agencies that fund and implement conformity requirements, we are uniquely qualified to assist EPA more accurately estimate burden hours and annual costs," their letter said.

"Accurate estimates of burden hours and conformity process costs will benefit future conformity determinations and amendments, as well as provide needed information to transportation and air quality agencies as they program scarce resources. We request that EPA reconsider the comments in our 2004 and 2011 letters regarding cost estimates, and convene a workgroup with representatives from state DOTs and MPOs to develop more accurate assumptions and methodologies before finalizing cost estimates for the ICR."

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Future for Missouri Senate gas tax hike proposal is 'Smoky'

The Missouri Senate last week gave initial approval to an increase in Missouri fuel taxes, but some leaders are concerned that might be as far as the bill gets.

"I'm thinking of the Burt Reynolds movie,"
Senate Leader Tom Dempsey (R-St. Charles)
told reporters in summing up the prospects of
the bill. "It's got a long [way] to go and a short
time to get there."

The proposal would raise Missouri's tax on diesel fuel 3.5-cents and on other fuel 1.5-cents. If passed, Senate projections are that it would raise \$54.6-million a year for transportation infrastructure, but Dempsey says language that would create a board to study tolling on I-70 could doom it.

"[I'm] hearing from some of our members that the amendment that Senator [Rob] Schaaf (R-St. Joseph) put on is problematic, so I'm not sure what's going to happen," said Dempsey.

If the proposal does make it out of the Senate, it could face a challenge in the House where Speaker John Diehl, Junior (R-Town and Country), had said transportation funding might have to wait until next year to be addressed. But, he told Missourinet his chamber would give it a look.

"Once they get it over to us we'll refer it to the appropriate committee to give it a fair hearing, and see whether or not it's something that we should pass out," Diehl told Missourinet.

Transportation officials say the bill would generate enough to match 160-million federal transportation dollars in the fiscal year that begins July 1, 2016, but additional state money would be needed to avoid losing federal dollars in years after that.

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Arkansas Delays 9 More Road Projects Worth \$120 Million From Contract **Bidding**

Citing uncertainty over federal funding, the Arkansas Highway and Transportation Department withdrew nine construction projects worth an estimated \$120 million from its schedules June 9 contract bidding, bringing its total of delayed projects so far this year to 70 that are valued at \$282 million.

The AHTD took the action as the Highway Trust Fund's program authority is currently set to expire May 31, so the state agency cannot count on normal federal reimbursements coming for project costs when contractors would need to be paid.

"Not only have we been forced to withdraw \$282 million from our bid openings in 2015, but there are only 24 days remaining until obligation authority expires for MAP-21," said AHTD Director Scott Bennett. "We operate on a cash basis and are not willing to take risks that would jeopardize the progress of any of our Federally-funded projects. To do otherwise is not being fiscally responsible."

In Washington, several key lawmakers have said Congress will extend the trust fund before it leaves in late May for an extended Memorial Day break, but it is not clear how long an extension will run.

And until it is in place, some states like Arkansas have to make their project plans based on current federal law. "We can't assume that since Congress has always fixed the Federal Highway Trust Fund at the last minute, they will do so again," Bennett said. "Such a piecemeal approach to highway funding in America is not healthy for our nation's aging infrastructure."



Already, at least five states have publicly detailed project delays that have put more than \$1.4 billion worth of work on hold that would otherwise be taking place this summer. Some reports have put the nationwide total over \$2 billion for delayed highway work due to trust fund uncertainty. Bennett indicated that if Congress opts for a short-term trust fund extension, his state could within a few months be back to delaying projects again.

"Our only choice is to withdraw projects from bid openings," Bennett emphasized. "Congress must commit to reaching a long-term solution so we aren't back at the crossroads again in a few months. The band-aid approach doesn't work. It only covers up the problem. It does not solve the problem."

The AHTD also updated its project delays on the "Nation at a Crossroads" infographic website produced by the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials. That site features a "state impact" section that shows how federal funding affects transportation investment for states that provided data.

"Arkansas is among the states helping AASHTO tell the highway funding story," the agency said, "by routinely updating its section of the site with the latest information as it becomes available." And it said the federal funding disruptions have put at risk Arkansas infrastructure that includes \$490 million in highway projects, \$32 million in transit projects and an estimated 11,000 jobs.

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Capitol Hill Signs Point Toward Trust Fund Extension to Late in Calendar Year

Top House members said they expect Congress to pass a short-term extension of Highway Trust Fund programs this month that would carry through the 2015 construction season and probably through December.

That would require lawmakers to come up with about \$10 billion in new revenue to shore up the fund, which is on course to hit a cash balance squeeze in July unless Congress replenishes it. Such an extension would follow the 10-month extension Congress approved last July, to extend the trust fund through May 31.

House Majority Leader Kevin McCarthy, R-Calif., told reporters April 28 that with the House having just nine legislative days during May, lawmakers were more likely to extend the Highway Trust Fund through the end of 2015 than try to get a long-term bill now.

Reuters reported that McCarthy said: "The ultimate goal is to do a long-term (bill), so five to seven years. The best way to get to a long-term one is to probably do a short-term one first."

McCarthy also said increasing federal user charges for motor fuels, often described as the gas tax, is "politically impossible," Reuters reported.

A number of states have acted this year to hike their own fuel fees, and many transportation advocates say increasing fuel fees at the federal level is the most effective way for Congress to boost the dedicated revenue stream for the Highway Trust Fund.



Separately, House Transportation Chairman Bill Shuster, R-Pa., told an April 28 National Journal forum: "It looks like we'll have to do a short-term patch to get to a longer-term bill."

Shuster said he wants to see a short-term extension that carries states through their 2015 construction season. Already, some states have delayed big-ticket construction projects due to lack of certainty over whether the federal funds would be available when project bills roll in.

Asked about recent comments by other lawmakers about trying to get a long-term bill done before the Sept. 30 end of the fiscal year, which would mean extending the trust fund through Sept. 30, Shuster told National Journal: "That doesn't get us through the entire construction season."

He added that his home state of Pennsylvania, for instance, would "need another month or so before they start to slow down" on 2015 work, while states in warmer areas have longer periods to complete their projects. "I think it's very important to get us through the construction season," Shuster said.

He also said Congress would need to find about \$10 billion for an extension lasting through December.

And U.S. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx told reporters he would support a short-term extension if it helps Congress produce a long-term authorization bill.

On April 30, House Ways and Means Chairman Paul Ryan, R-Wis., told reporters he will unveil a short-term extension measure in about three more weeks that would probably go through December and cost about \$10 billion.

Ryan said he was working with Republican and Democratic committee leaders in both the House and Senate to work out the details.

"We'll do a patch through the year, I believe," Transport Topics reported him saying, with "a combination of pay-fors."

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The House is scheduled to be out for its Memorial Day recess after May 21, so it would need to act on the trust fund authority by then, while the Senate's last scheduled day before the recess is May 22.

In the wake of those comments, Bud Wright, executive director of the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials, told AASHTO Journal: "The state departments of transportation that AASHTO represents will of course be glad to see Congress acting to prevent an outright disruption of federal highway and transit programs.

"Still, our state DOTs need the certainty that only a long-term federal program can provide, and short extensions are already delaying some state construction projects," Wright said.

"We know Congress is hearing from state officials and business leaders saying these extensions produce funding cliffs that hamper the contract bidding and finance plans for highway projects, which are crucial to economic growth back home. It is our hope this next extension congressional leaders are discussing will soon lead to a multiyear program authorization."
